SPECIAL OFFERING IN JULY FOR AFGHAN REFUGEE FAMILY

For the last several months, Covenant's Mission Team has been partnering with Jonesborough Presbyterian Church in the process of co-sponsoring an Afghan refugee family. We are on track to welcome this family to Johnson City very soon! Given the inherent expenses of setting up a new home, purchasing clothes and household goods, and everything that comes with a transition of this magnitude, **Covenant is taking up a special offering for this family.** Please give generously as the Spirit leads you! AN OPPORTUNITY TO HELP FEED LOCAL CHILDREN

As you might be aware, the Langston Centre has weekly summer camps for children through the end of July. These camps are part of the **summer feeding program** through the Johnson City schools, but that feeding program ended in June. Langston provides a morning and afternoon snack along with lunch to the children in the camps. They have 33 students registered every week of camp, and it costs approximately \$123 a week to feed the campers. They also provide bottled water (small 8 oz.) to the campers and are always in need of water. Dropping off cases of water or grocery/Sam's Club gift cards would be much appreciated. Langston Centre is located at 315 Elm St in Johnson City. Or, if you would like to drop these items off at the church, we will arrange for them to be taken to the Langston Centre for you.

AFFIRMING ALL GOD'S CHILDREN

We at Covenant Presbyterian Church of Johnson City, Tennessee, under the auspices of the Presbyterian Church (USA), aka PC(USA), present its Churchwide Antiracism Policy, first adopted in 1999 and revised in 2016. It proclaims the following:

“While recognizing that racism victimizes many different racial ethnic groups, we acknowledge its unique impact on the African American community. Given the particular forms that anti-Black racism has taken in the United States of America, both historically (including slavery and Jim Crow) and today (including mass incarceration, disproportionate policing, economic inequality, and continuing acts of racially oriented violence and hate), we state clearly: **GOD LOVES BLACKNESS**. Too many have denied this basic truth for too long. Our choice to align ourselves with love and not hate requires both a rejection of racism and a positive proclamation that God delights in Black lives.”


