Rise Up for Kids is dedicated to inspiring, influencing, and impacting kids to one day attain post high school training and education degrees through mentoring, after school, and relationship education programs. Since 1994, over 1,000 students have attended our afterschool programs. Others attended our small groups or relational education classes.

Our Mission: By 2027, to inspire another 100 youth to succeed through small groups, after school, and individual mentoring.

Our Vision: To inspire kids to be relationally successful and prepared for the future.

Our Core Values: We believe that youth who come to Rise Up...

- **BELONG HERE:** Everyone needs family and community to thrive.
- **NEVER JUST ACT OUT:** If they are walking outside the lines, we must ask “Why is this kid acting this way?” or, “What happened to you?”
- **SHOULD BE PRAYED FOR:** Regardless of whether one is inclined to pray or not, everyone should have someone who will, just for a moment, think heavenly thoughts of them.
- **HAVE GREAT FUTURES:** We are called to help them realize it.
- **NEED ACCEPTANCE:** Every youth’s story is different, but all need to be accepted and loved without judgement, which is different from approval.
- **WILL KNOW THAT GOD LOVES THEM:** We are a traditional Christ-based program, but emphasize that not everyone will think, act, or believe as we do. However, all children should believe they are loved by us.
- **NEED CHEERLEADERS & COACHES:** The need to be taught life skills (coaches) and told they have what it takes and are unique and divinely made (cheerleaders).
- **LEARN TO THINK:** Youth need to be tender-hearted but tough-minded, and be able to think truthfully in a world that sends so many messages of “you’re not enough,” and “think only of yourself”.

FOR THE FUTURE OF GUANGAJE ECUADOR

Guangaje, Ecuador is a parish in the Cotopaxi Province. Situated south of Quito, the capital of Ecuador, it is home to approximately 7,000 indigenous Quichua people. They trace their ancestry back to the Incas. Guangaje is comprised of 34 small communities located at altitudes ranging from 11-13,500 feet. Due to centuries of racism and economic isolation, and its own altiplano ecology (limited rain, cold, wind), this area is one of the poorest in Ecuador, even the Western Hemisphere. Almost all of the population lives in extreme poverty. Many of the communities lack clean, reliable sources of water. Health care access and educational opportunities are limited. The government approved starting a regional high school just in 2012, with about 25 graduates per year starting in 2015. Indigenous youth from Guangaje desire to advance their education and improve their opportunities in life, but they lack the resources to do so.

Our Mission is to support the optimal development of the youth in Guangaje and create future leaders, while honoring the culture and history of the Quichua people through:

1. Scholarships for youth attending university or vocational institutions.
2. Support for youth engagement in sports, art, music & community service.

THE RIVER

The River serves women and children in our community through a variety of services and the practice of radical hospitality. Core services help women meet basic needs, and support services move them towards self-sufficiency. Since 2004, The River has served thousands of women & children in need by providing a safe place, laundry and shower services, feminine hygiene assistance, mail and telephone support, resource referrals, free haircuts, pet therapy, a diaper subsidy program providing over 5,000 diapers a month, a creativity space and writing center, daily devotions, Intentional giving distribution days, Little Free Library, snacks and beverages, monthly BINGO, special events, and a supportive, non-judgmental, and welcoming space for ALL women. Our motto is “sharing loads of God's love.”

HOLSTON PRESBYTERY CAMP

Every summer since 1952, Holston Camp has welcomed kids seeking a refuge from the seasonal heat and a sanctuary for spiritual, mental and physical growth into 150 acres of forest, lakes and streams nestled in the mountains of Banner Elk, NC. Ours is a tradition of small group camping. We furnish minds, bodies and souls with skills essential to both social and character development with an emphasis on Christian values. Eight week-long sessions of overnight and day camps offer young people the opportunity to step away from the mundane, to unplug and embark on a spiritual journey where they may recognize a greater purpose for their lives.

We don't preach, we engage. We don't bully, we encourage. We don't discriminate, we include. We don't judge, we love. We are about being positive and optimistic as we rise to meet the challenges of the new day. We walk a path toward discovery & enlightenment as we embrace God's boundless gifts and share them with all people.

But for the other 10 months of the year, we are a multi-facility retreat center complete with lodging, dining hall, activities within a campus of wooded trails, crystal streams, and mountain vistas. SECOND HARVEST FOOD BANK

The Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast TN has led the effort to end hunger in our area since 1986 and serves the 8-county region composed of Carter, Greene, Hancock, Hawkins, Johnson, Sullivan, Unicoi, and Washington counties. Since federal nutrition programs don't reach everyone in need, food banks help fill the gap. For every \$1 donated, Second Harvest Food Bank can provide up to \$8.69 worth of groceries.

Second Harvest collects and distributes food throughout our community using a variety of programs and services including:

- **Food for Kids Backpack Program:** supplies a bag of healthy food and snacks to children who are most at risk for hunger to take home from school every other weekend during the school year.
- **Summer Food Service Program:** serves meals to children who would not otherwise have enough to eat during the summer months.
- **Fresh Produce Distribution:** distributes fresh produce to individuals and families in low-income communities.
- **Mobile Food Pantry:** delivers food directly to people in areas where a food pantry or soup kitchen may not be available.
- **Senior Grocery Program:** provides food distribution to low-income seniors, increasing their access to food.
- **Breakfast After the Bell:** provides alternative breakfast models for schools to ensure children have a hunger free start to their day.

BEAR ANOTHER'S BURDEN'S MINISTRY OF CHRIST

BABMOC School provides primary education free of charge to Liberian children whose parents can't afford to pay the fees for them to attend other existing schools.

We now have 160 students grades K thru 6th grade attending our school in Monrovia, Liberia. We also have developed a scholarship program which allows 18 of our graduated 6th graders to attend the 7th grade at nearby secondary schools. We are really excited that we can help them continue their education.

A native of Liberia, our founder, Isaac Mayon noted on a return visit home from America in 2009 that many children were not in school because their parents could not afford the fees, transportation, and supplies. A direct result of kids not being in school is that the literacy rate in Liberia is astoundingly low.

Bear Another's Burdens Ministry of Christ (BABMOC) built and opened a school that serves elementary-aged children on September 4, 2017. Our school is going strong and the hope is that this project will serve as a model for others in Liberia to join in the goal of providing totally free education to every child.

Our campus at the school also now has a deep water well providing the school and surrounding community with water that is WHO certified safe. This year, we expanded our solar powered battery system so that the water can be pumped consistently throughout the day and at night.

It costs \$15 per student per month to attend the BABMOC School. The amount to sponsor one child's education for one year is \$150.
